



In 1974, the Fair Oaks Chamber of Commerce printed this photo of the Northridge Shopping Center, located at the corner of Sunset Ave and San Juan Ave, in the Fair Oaks Business and Professional Directory. The stores that were located on the north of Sunset Avenue were:


Bank of America, Fair Oaks Hardware, Groth's Bootery, Jet Auto Supply, Ken's Mobil Station, Lady LaVerne Beauty Northridge Salon, Barber Shop, Northridge Coffee Shop, Raleys Drug Super Raleys Market, Center, Northridge Music Center, Northridge Shoe Repair, Richardson's, Swanson's Cleaners, TG&Y Family Center, and The Round Table Restaurant.


The stores on the south side were: Curly's Cleaners, San Juan Club, Sunset Barber Shop, and Sunset Food Spot

By the following year, Gorth's Bootery, Richardson's, and TG&Y Family Center had closed.


When Raley's first opened in the early 1960s, they had some well-known sport figures like San Francisco Giants players Willie Mays, Tom Haller, and some players from the San Francisco 49ers sign autographs. Northridge Music Center was first on California Avenue where the Fair Oaks Brew Pub is now then moved to Northridge Shopping Center. The Round Table Restaurant was not a pizza place. The manager of the restaurant was Joe Campoy. William Amantea designed the interior and exterior of the building and painted the murals. The replicas of battle gear used in King Arther's time were created by Facundo Campoy.

If pizza was desired, the nearest place to Northridge Shopping Center was Shakey's Pizza on Winding Way near San Juan, which is now Mirabelle Café.

Also, in the 1974 Fair Oaks Business and Professional Directory is an advertisement for Suzie-Q Drive-In which is now the Sunflower Drive-In on the corner of Sacramento Street and Main Steet (next to the History Center).

SPECIAL DISPLAY AT THE HISTORY CENTER

March 2024

Twelve **clothes pin dolls** will be on display at the Fair Oaks History Center during the month of March 2024. These intricately dressed and appointed dolls were crafted by **Edith Ellen Sachs De Giorgis** (1913-2008), a native of Sacramento, in her later

years.

Mrs. De Giorgis was the daughter of Charles (Karl) W. Sachs (1883-1943), an immigrant from Germany. He was an engineer with Sacramento's Buffalo Brewery for 30 years. Mrs. De Giorgis' mother was Rosina M. Sachs (1886-1976), a native of Zamora, California.
