Welcome to the Fair Oaks Virtual Walking Tour. For your convenience we have divided the tour into four "Loops":


Loop1 - History Center Area




The Fair Oaks Historical Society was formed in 1975 to preserve the history and heritage of Fair Oaks. The Historical Society conducts research, records oral histories, has published a booklet: The Early Years of Fair Oaks, and has reproduced a 1900 map of Fair Oaks. Located at 10340 Fair Oaks Blvd., our History Center was established as a repository and museum of Fair Oaks artifacts.

What we do:

- Collect and preserve historic documents, photos and artifacts related to Fair Oaks history
- Provide access to the public on all materials in our collections
- Research questions from the public on Fair Oaks history
- Maintain a History Center where the public can observe displays, photos, artifacts and documents, and discuss questions with a trained docent
- Display videos and slide shows in a theater setting
- Provide access to over 800 historic Fair Oaks photos and assist local businesses and individuals in using the photos for displays
- Give talks on Fair Oaks history to local civic and educational groups
- Conduct virtual and guided historic walking tours of the Fair Oaks Village and vicinity
- Conduct fundraisers and pursue grants
- Provide gift items of a Fair Oaks Historical theme
- Participate in community events such as the Chicken Festival, Fair Oaks Fiesta, Safe Halloween and Memorial Day
- Cooperate with other community services such as Parks, Rotary, Thursday Club and others to promote the Fair Oaks Community
- Maintain an on-line presence with a website and Facebook page devoted to Fair Oaks history

To accomplish this mission the Fair Oaks History Center will:


- preserve the historical record of the area known as Fair Oaks, California 95628; that of its first inhabitants, the San Juan Rancho, the early settlers of the Sunset Colony and of succeeding generations.
- educate the public on the history of Fair Oaks and its people through written, oral and media presentations, website publication and social media, and respond to public inquiries regarding Fair Oaks History.
- establish, operate and maintain an educational and research center and museum on Fair Oaks History for the benefit of the general public.
- conduct research on the founders of Fair Oaks, and the agricultural, civic, religious and cultural activities throughout its history, and to keep authoritative and permanent recordings of the facts in a repository.
